Antwerp 2016 report

A group of 32 Brighton swimmers attended the 25th Antwerp International Youth Swimming

Cup in Belgium for the 3 day event from Friday 22nd to Sunday 24th April. It was a high

caliber event with 61 teams and over 900 swimmers including Belgium swimmers preparing

for the Olympics in Rio.

We left at 8am from Brighton travelling by coach to Dover and across the English Channel to

Calais and driving to Antwerp ready for the days racing starting at 5.30pm. The team stayed

two nights in Antwerp with early rises for the 6.15am breakfast ready for the 7.15am warm

up.

Team Brighton made the most noise of any fans on Saturday evening cheering on Theo

Matanle during the youth 100m backstroke final in which he swam a personal best time, then

celebrating Dominic Polling's victory in the open 100m backstroke final followed 10 minutes

later with another final appearance for Dom in the 100m butterfly.

The facilities at the Olympic swimming complex are excellent with two 50m pools and the

host club ZOLA made us feel extremely welcome with many swimmers exchanging hats on

the final day. After cheering on Dominic Polling to win the open 200m Medley final the team

travelled back home arriving in the early hours of Monday morning.

Brighton swimmers came away with 6 GOLD, 3 SILVER and 3 BRONZE Medals!

Gold medals were won by Ben Devriendt, Dominic Polling (x4) and Laurie Seymour.

All swimmers had valuable long course race experience especially with the 50m warm up

pool and all achieved 1 or more pb's.
